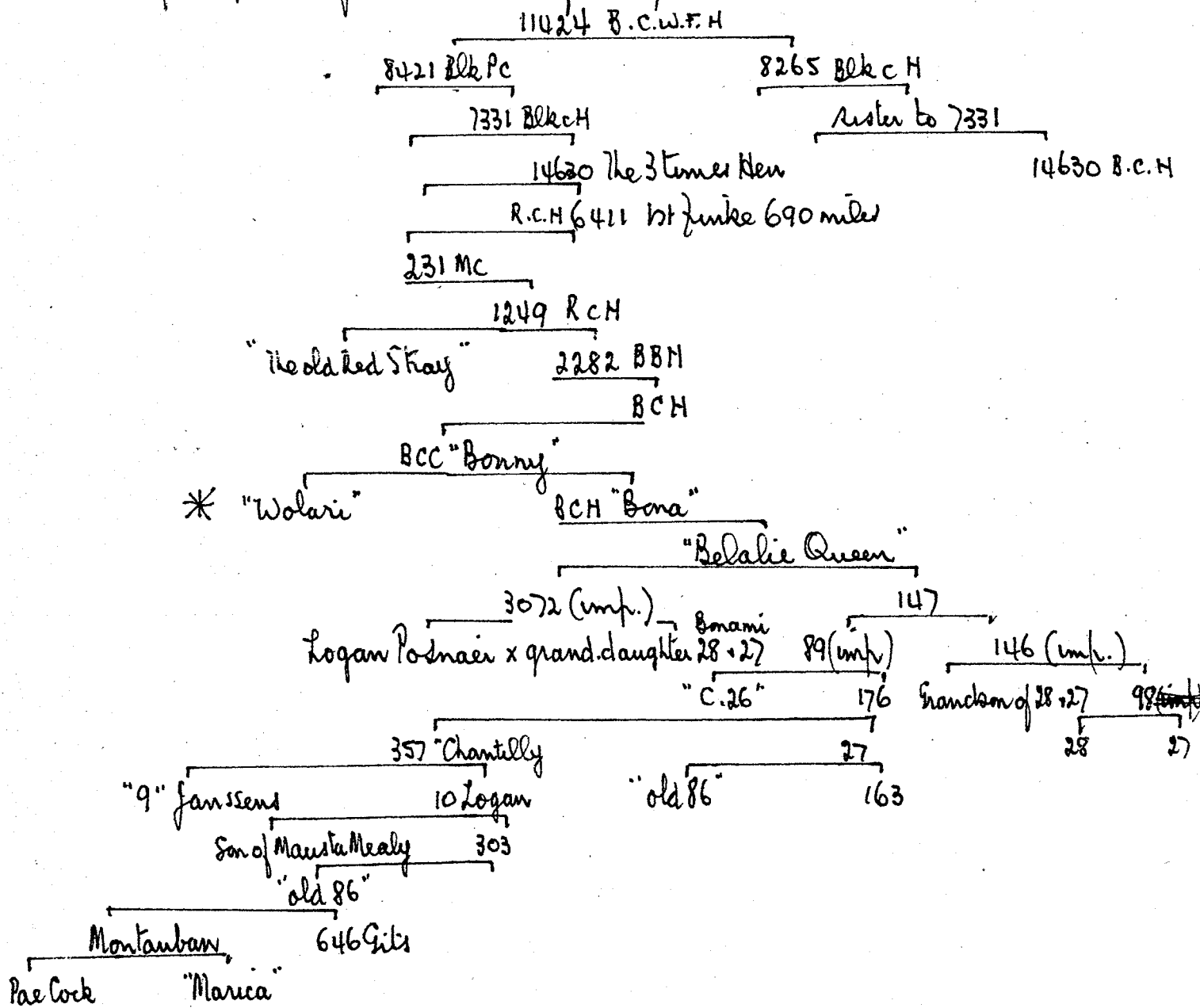


11424 S.A.A. 62 B.C.W.F.H. "Kalgoorlie Girl"

The first pigeon to fly 1000 miles in South Australia (Kalgoorlie, West Aust., to Adelaide, South Aust., 1040 miles in 1965.)

Bred from first Cousins. Sire a son of 7331, dam, out of a sister to 7331
 7331 winner of 1st SAHPA Alice Springs (830 miles) by 3½ hours. Her dam flew
 Alice Springs three years in a row for unplaced, 12th SAHPA - 7th SAHPA.

* The sire of "Wolari" was "Kade" and the dam of "Wolari" was "Duchess"

"Kade" was by "Monarch" (imp. Royal) out of "Britannia" (imp. Royal)

"Duchess" was by "Edward VII" (imp. Royal) out of a daughter of Talbot's imported Royal pair.

Burtin's "Alfonso" also figures in the bloodlines of "Kalgoorlie Girl". Other bloodlines include DeBue, Harrison, Jurin and the old original Logans imported from Logan by I. Taylor at the turn of this Century.

These Logans were later procured by S.M. Evans

The 7 and 8 Baker blood is also represented.

"Kalgoorlie Girl" carries 33 crosses of "The old Red Stray", the founder of my strain. He was believed to be of the S.M. Evans family.

He was not bred by Evans, but Spencer Evans told me in 1928 that he was certain he was the produce of his 28 and 27 Bonami blood.

Of the five birds to fly Kalgoorlie in 1965, three were of the same bloodlines of "Kalgoorlie Girl".

Two birds were timed 3 days after "Kalgoorlie Girl", and one of the two was a daughter of a sister to 14630 (The Three Times Ten). The fifth bird home was a granddaughter of 14630.

There is no better long-distance blood in Australia
