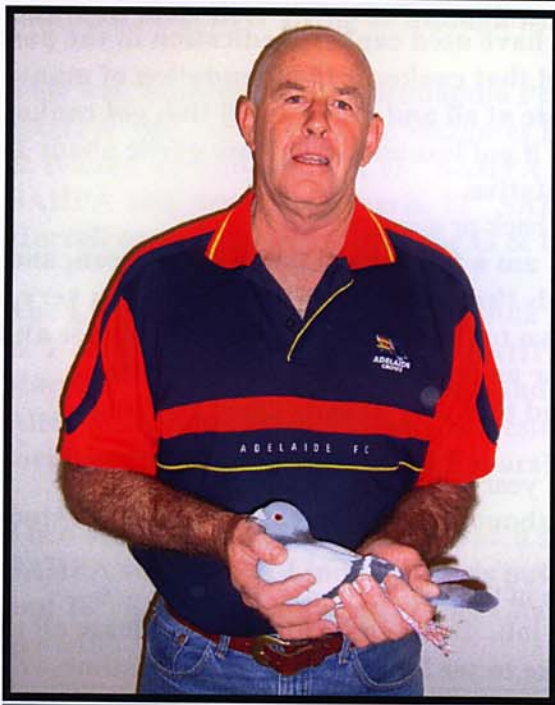
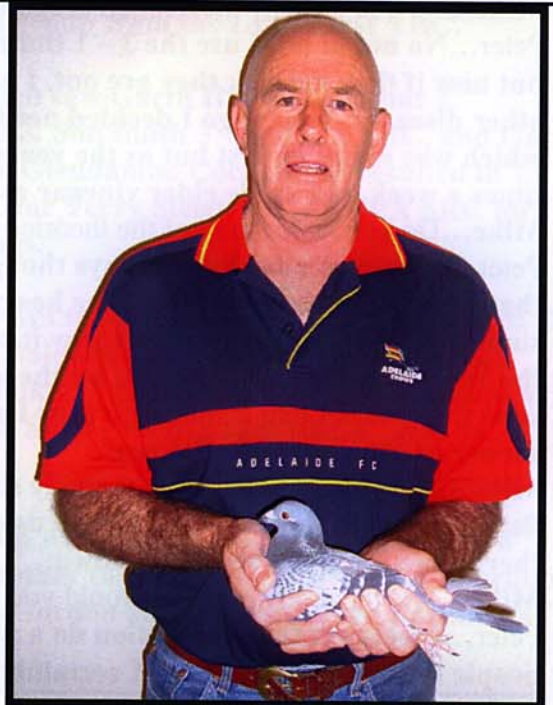


Peter Blaser Winner of Moulamein S.A.D. and Moulamein Open

Mike... What are the bloodlines of your winners?

Peter... The winner of the Moulamein Open is a late bred with an old ring and hatched the last week in February, she had not dropped a flight... her Sire was Metcalf, and his dam was inbred to Allan Goodger's lot 60. The dam was a full sister to my first Assoc Wilcannia Cock Bird Special, she has the same Sire as the Winner thus half brother half sister mating, and the grandma is a Janssen Wonderboy 05 Hen.

The Derby Winner's Dam was a Busschaert Hen and the Sire was from an Alvin Richardson hen closely related to John Pryor's top stock Hen and his Sire was my Metcalf family.

Mike... How many races did your birds have before their wins?

Peter... The S.A.D. winner flew Paruna on the 18th June and Ouyen on the 30th July then into the Derby. The Moulamein Open Winner had 2 Parunas an Ouyen and then the Moulamein Open.

Mike... Did you race your birds again after they won?

Peter... Yes I did, sadly the winner of the derby was taken by a Falcon around the loft, and the Moulamein Open winner went to the hard Boorooban and was home at 5:50am on the second morning.

Mike... How much loft flying do your birds do each day?

Peter... They only get let out once a day, and as I am always trying to trick the falcons, they are let out at various times, and they fly 45 to 60 minutes.
