**Mike...**What is the breeding of the bird that won the Lyndhurst open?

**Phil...**Mostly Janssen of Ponderosa pair # 13

**Mike...**How many races did your bird have leading up to its win?

**Phil...**It had 2 races leading up to the Derby, a Stirling North and a Parachilna.

**Mike...** Did you race the bird again after it won?

**Phil...**No I stopped it after it won, it was my second Association Win and I did not want to chance losing it.

**Mike...**How much loft flying do your birds do each day?

**Phil...**I like to see them do at least an hour or more each afternoon, as I work in the early mornings, afternoon training is all I can do.

**Mike...**How much tossing do you give your birds?

**Phil...** I mainly toss on the Association Transporter on the weekends.

**Mike...**Do you follow any particular feeding pattern?

**Phil...**No, I just look at what the weather is, and if it is going to be a hard race, I increase the Maize and Peas, and if it is going to be a quick race, I decrease them.

**Mike...**Do you medicate often?

**Phil...**I use Turbosole in the water on a Monday after they have been away in the Race Unit, to control wet canker.

**Mike...**How many birds do you generally start the season with?

**Phil...**Usually I start with about 220 birds, mostly young birds, as I feel that old birds are only good for the first few races, then after that, the young birds usually dominate.

**Mike...**What changes would you like to see in the sport?

**Phil...**I would like to see a bit more harmony in the sport, also I would like to see more prize money in some sort of way, and to get younger flyers interested in the sport.
